Eathorpe H put in a solid all round performance in Division B, which earned them a 4-1 win over Eathorpe I. John Gymer won his two for H, Steven Ayers won one and the pair took the doubles. Jonathan Milton secured the I side's consolation.

Rugby J defeated Free Church K 4-1, with Jack Koumi taking a brace. Richard Pittaway took a point for Church, but a single from Majinder Dosanjh and the doubles from Majinder and Jack completed a good win for Rugby. Majinder won another single, when Rugby J played Free Church J, but two from Jack Hobbins, one from Anita Whitehouse, plus the doubles left Church as 4-1 winners.

Free Church N had a little too much for Free Church L, taking all singles on offer through Andy Kendall and James Payne. Ben Haigh and Solomon Hayes did get some reward for their efforts though, taking the doubles in the 4-1 defeat. In Division C, Free Church R squeezed past Eathorpe J 3-2. Charlie Snelson and Callum Guest took one each plus a vital doubles for Church. 'Thorpe's points were both taken by Keith Jenkins. Not so good for Church R against Free Church S as Kris Reiman and Matthew Flood overpowered them 5-0.

Free Church S followed up with a 4-1 victory over Eathorpe K. Matthew Flood won his two, Kris Reiman one and the pair added the doubles. Brandon Tedd marked his debut with a fine single. Free Church O pair Solomon and Matthew Hayes were 5-0 winners over club mates, Free Church Q.

Gary Stewart had two stunning five game victories for Division 1 outfit, Wellesbourne, but those were the only success 'Bourne had as Colebridge Aces ran out 8-2 winners thanks to an Ian Ferguson hat-trick, two from both Sasha Grokhotov and Eddie Lynn, plus the doubles.
