



# Week commencing 12 April 2010

**S**nitterfield B held their nerve in two close Division 4 matches, showing excellent grit and determination to win them both 6-4. Against WCC Eagles, Vince Ford and John Walker both picked up two, with Richard Bennett adding a single, plus the doubles with Vince. For the Eagles, Harry Mackinson and Terry Babbage both won two.

Against Eathorpe B, Ron Shakesheff won his three, with John Walker and Richard Bennett adding two and one respectively. Michael Rossington kept two for Eathorpe, Paul Deavall one, and the pair added the doubles. Against Eathorpe D, however, Snitterfield came unstuck. Allan Stockham, Holly Thompson and Simon Thompson took all the singles available, with Snitterfield's only respite coming in the doubles, which was won by Vince Ford and Richard Bennett.
